

FAQ - ACEA RUN4ROME RELAY RACE

BEFORE THE EVENT

Can I participate in the relay race?

Participation is open to athletes aged 18 or older on the day of the event. Each athlete must have a medical certificate for non-competitive sports activity (a certificate for competitive activity is also valid) or submit the appropriate self-declaration form.

For relay legs shorter than 10 km, participants aged 16 or older on the day of the event are also allowed.

Registration for the Run4Rome Relay is by team. If you haven't done it yet, find three friends who want to run with you and register together! Alternatively, ask the Charity you wish to support to help you find three teammates.

Is it mandatory to choose a Charity to participate in the Run4Rome Relay?

Yes, you must register through one of the charities participating in the Run4Rome Charity Program. You can find the list and contact info of participating NGOs at:

The goals of the relay are simple:

- Have fun with your friends
- Raise funds to support important charitable projects

REGISTRATION

How can we purchase bibs?

Bibs for the "Acea Run4Rome" relay can be purchased:

- Through the participating charities (each charity sets its own donation fee. Registration must then be completed on www.runromethemarathon.com using the code provided). This is not just a registration fee—it is a true donation to support a charitable project of your choice.

Can we register and pay on site?

No, registration and payment must be completed using the procedures outlined above.

Until when can we register?

Final registration must be completed on the event website, in the appropriate section, by March 13, 2026.

Can we register even if we don't yet have the medical certificate?

Yes, medical certificates or the self-declaration must be shown only when collecting the bibs.

How can we check if our registration is complete?

The online registration portal automatically sends a confirmation email to each team member once the Charity validates the team's registration. Additional practical information will be sent a few days before the race.

What should we do in case of problems with the online registration?

Contact run4rome@evodata.it and you'll receive a reply within 48 working hours.

When and how do we decide the relay order?

Further information on this will be sent to registered participants as race day approaches.

Confirmation Letter

A few days before the race, all team members will receive an email that serves as the official "confirmation letter".

This email will include all essential instructions for bib collection and participation. You do not need to print it—showing it on a smartphone or tablet is sufficient.

Where do we collect the bibs?

You can collect your bib (and race kit) at the Run Rome The Marathon Expo. The location and opening times of the Expo Village will be announced once they are officially confirmed by the organizers.

What documents are needed to collect the bibs?

To collect the bibs, the team members or the team representative or a delegate must present:

- Valid ID (for all team members)
- Confirmation email (on smartphone or tablet)
- Medical certificates or the corresponding self-declarations (for all team members)

Can I collect my bib on race day?

No.

SECURITY PROCEDURES

In accordance with current regulations, specific safety procedures will be implemented. In particular, no containers (bags, backpacks, etc.) other than the official bag provided by the organization (marked with your bib number label) will be allowed into the technical area. All items must be placed loose inside the official bag to allow for quick and thorough inspection by security staff.

Additional details, including any health protocols, will be provided in the days leading up to the race and summarized in the “race day info”.

BAG DROP SERVICE

Organizers will provide a free bag drop service near the start area of each relay leg. Details on how this service will be managed will be communicated before the event and included in the “race day info”.

Do not leave personal valuables (phones, wallets, etc.) in your race bag. The organization cannot be held responsible for theft or loss, though they will handle the bags with the utmost care.

Getting to the Relay Change Points

Further information will be provided and included in the “race day info” closer to the event.

RACE DAY

When is the relay and what time does it start?

The Acea Run4Rome will take place on Sunday, March 22, 2026.

Start time may be subject to change due to technical, organizational, or health requirements.

The first leg is tentatively scheduled to start at 9:00 AM from Via dei Fori Imperiali. The exact access time and location for the starting area will be communicated in due time.

Start of the following legs

Runners of the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th legs must go to the changeover area corresponding to their team's number. Each change zone is marked by numbered signs. Your team number is on your bib.

The relay handover procedure will be explained later and summarized in the “race day info”.

Will there be refreshment stations on the course?

Yes, in accordance with the rules, refreshment stations will be located at the finish and along the route every 5 kilometers at most.
Each runner will receive refreshments at the end of their leg.

Timing and Results

Timing will be measured and results processed via an electronic transponder system (“chip”) provided during bib pickup along with instructions.
Athletes or teams who remove or damage the chip will not be timed and will not appear in the results (listed alphabetically by team).

Where can I find the results?

Results (alphabetically by team) will be available via links on www.runromethemarathon.com. You can also download your participation certificate there.

Medical Services

Adequate medical support will be provided along the course, with a medical station at the end of each leg.

After Each Relay Leg

After completing their leg, each runner will receive their finisher’s medal, access to final refreshments and post-race services (bag drop, toilets, etc.), before returning by public transport to Circo Massimo, where they will join their team’s final runner to cross the finish line together and enjoy the activities in the Finisher’s Village.
