

ACEA RUN4ROME RELAY – FAQ

PRE-EVENT

Can I take part in the relay?

Participation is open to athletes who are **18 years of age or older** on the day of the event. Each athlete must hold a **valid medical certificate of fitness for non-competitive sports activities** (a competitive sports medical certificate is also accepted).

During registration, **you must accept a waiver form** in which you declare that you are in adequate health to participate in the race and **release the organisers from any liability**.

One of the four relay legs will be shorter than 10 km; for this leg, participation is also allowed for athletes who have turned 16 by the date of the event.

Registration for the Run4Rome Relay can be completed as a team or individually.

If you haven't already done so, find three friends who would like to run with you and register together! Alternatively, you may also register individually and we will assign you to a team.

Is it mandatory to choose a Charity to take part in the Run4Rome Relay?

Yes. Registration must be completed directly through one of the charities participating in the Run4Rome Charity Program.

The goals of the relay are very simple:

1. to have fun with your friends
2. to raise funds in support of important charitable projects

REGISTRATION

How do I purchase race bibs?

Race bibs for the **Acea Run4Rome Relay** can be **only purchased through the charities** participating in the project (with a contribution amount freely determined by each charity).

Registration must then be finalized on www.runromethemarathon.com using the code received from the charity.

This is not a standard entry fee, but a **donation** in support of one of the many charitable projects available.

Is it possible to register and pay on-site?

No. Registration and payment must be completed in advance using the procedure described above.

Until when is it possible to register?

Final registration must be completed on the official event website, in the dedicated section, **by 10/03/2026**, unless the deadline is changed due to a sold-out event or capacity limits.

Can we register even if we do not yet have a medical certificate?

Yes. During registration, **it is mandatory to accept the liability waiver form**, in which participants self-certify that they hold a valid medical certificate for sports participation.

Medical certificates or self-declarations **will NOT be checked** by staff at the bib collection desks.

How can we check that our registration has been successfully completed?

The online registration system automatically sends a **confirmation email** to each team member once

the codes provided by the charities have been redeemed.
Additional practical information will be sent to participants a few days before the race.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I EXPERIENCE ISSUES WITH THE ONLINE REGISTRATION PROCESS?

When and how is the running order of relay legs decided?

Further details regarding the procedure will be communicated directly by the non-profit organizations.

CONFIRMATION LETTER

A few days before the race, **all team members will receive an email** valid as the official “confirmation letter.”

This email will include all essential instructions for bib collection and race participation.

It is not necessary to print the email; it may be shown on a smartphone or tablet.

BIB COLLECTION

Where do we collect our race bibs?

Race bibs (and the race pack) can be collected at the Run Rome The Marathon Expo.

The Expo will be open to the public on:

Thursday 19 March, Friday 20 March and Saturday 21 March 2026 From 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Location: Circo Massimo, 00153 Rome, Italy

(Location and opening hours may be subject to change)

Recommended metro stop: Circo Massimo (Line B – Blue)

Race bibs and race packs may be collected by:

Individual team members

The entire team

A team representative

A delegate collecting for one or more team members

Which documents are required to collect race bibs?

To collect the bibs, team members, the team representative, or a delegate must present:

- A valid ID document (for all team members)
- The confirmation email (shown on smartphone or tablet)

Can I collect my bib on race day?

No.

SECURITY PROCEDURES

In compliance with current regulations, specific security procedures will be implemented.

In particular, no bags, backpacks or containers will be allowed inside the technical area, except for the official bag provided by the organization, clearly marked with the athlete’s bib number.

All items must be placed loose inside the official bag to allow for quick and accurate security checks.

Further information and details, including any health and safety protocols, will be provided to athletes in the days leading up to the race and summarized in the “Race Day Info.”

BAG DROP SERVICE

A free bag drop service will be available near the start area of each relay leg.

Detailed procedures for the relay bag drop service will be communicated later and summarized in the “Race Day Info” distributed in the days before the event.

Participants are strongly advised not to leave valuables (mobile phones, wallets, etc.) inside the bag drop bag.

Although the organization will take the utmost care, it cannot be held responsible for any loss or theft.

GETTING TO AND FROM THE RELAY CHANGEOVER POINTS

Further information will be provided at a later date and summarized in the "Race Day Info" prior to the event.

RACE DAY

What is the date of the relay and the start time of the first leg?

The Acea Run4Rome Relay will take place on **Sunday, 22 March 2026**.

Please note that start times may be subject to change due to technical, organizational or health-related requirements.

The start of the first leg will be at 9:00 a.m. on Via dei Fori Imperiali.

Access times to the start area will be communicated later.

(Start time and location may be subject to change.)

Start of subsequent relay legs

Runners of the second, third and fourth legs **must position themselves in the changeover zone corresponding to their relay number**.

Each changeover zone will be clearly marked with numbered signs.

Your relay number is indicated on your race bib.

The changeover procedure will be communicated later and summarized in the "Race Day Info" prior to the event.

Will there be refreshment stations along the course?

In accordance with regulations, refreshment stations will be available at the finish area and along the course, no more than 5 km apart.

Each runner will receive post-leg refreshments at the end of their relay segment.

TIMING AND RESULTS

Timing and results will be managed using an electronic transponder system ("chip"), which will be provided at bib collection along with usage instructions.

Athletes and/or teams who remove, damage or tamper with the chip will not be timed and will not appear in the results lists, which will be displayed in alphabetical order by team name.

Where can I find the results?

Results lists (alphabetical by team) will be available via the dedicated links on www.runromethemarathon.com.

Participants will also be able to download their participation certificate.

MEDICAL SERVICES

Adequate medical assistance will be provided along the course, with a medical station at the end of each relay leg.

AFTER EACH RELAY LEG

After finishing each leg, relay runners will be directed to:

Collect their participation medal

Access the refreshment area

Use post-finish services (bag drop, toilets, etc.)

Public transport connections will be available to return to the finish area and the event village at Circo Massimo.
